



Hospice of Citrus County Steps Up For the Environment

HOMOSASSA—Volunteers and staff of Hospice of Citrus County gathered over the weekend to begin planting thousands of wetland plants at the new construction site on Periwinkle Lane in Homosassa.

The new building, located on the south end of the twelve acre site, will provide space for the Clinical Team that serves patients and families on the west coast of Citrus County, a Thrift Shoppe and the new Wings Center for Education. The northern end of the property will be preserved in it's natural state. Volunteers are planting Pickerelweed, Duck Potato, Canna, Maidencane, Soft Rush, Arrowhead, String Lilly and Burrmarigold to improve the habitat for local species of animals and birds.
